Hand Injury

## Summary of Incident

An associate was working on the element line, moving and packaging cut elements from the guillotine to the element box. During this task, the associate noticed a pair of elements cut by the guillotine sitting in the wrong position. While trying to adjust them, a second pair of elements dropped from the transfer belt striking and cutting the associate's right index finger.

#### **Critical Factors**

- The procedure for this operation states that where any intervention is required by associates, the element line must be stopped before any intervention can be taken
- The hand protection being worn by the associate did not offer the right level of protection against cutting hazards

## Corrective Actions

- Reinforce the importance of associates following the correct procedure for this task
- Conduct a review of the risk assessment and task procedure.
  An action plan should be developed for any identified areas of improvements
- Conduct a review of the adequacy of PPE for the task. Review should include consulting with associates, taking onboard any feedback to identify suitable hand protection
